Guinea's context

- COVID-19 first case on March 12, 2020
- Socio-political instability
- Fragile health system with lack of commitment from its leaders
- Spread of the pandemic throughout the country, with 28 524 confirmed cases (August 20, 2021), despite implementation of a set of response measures.
