

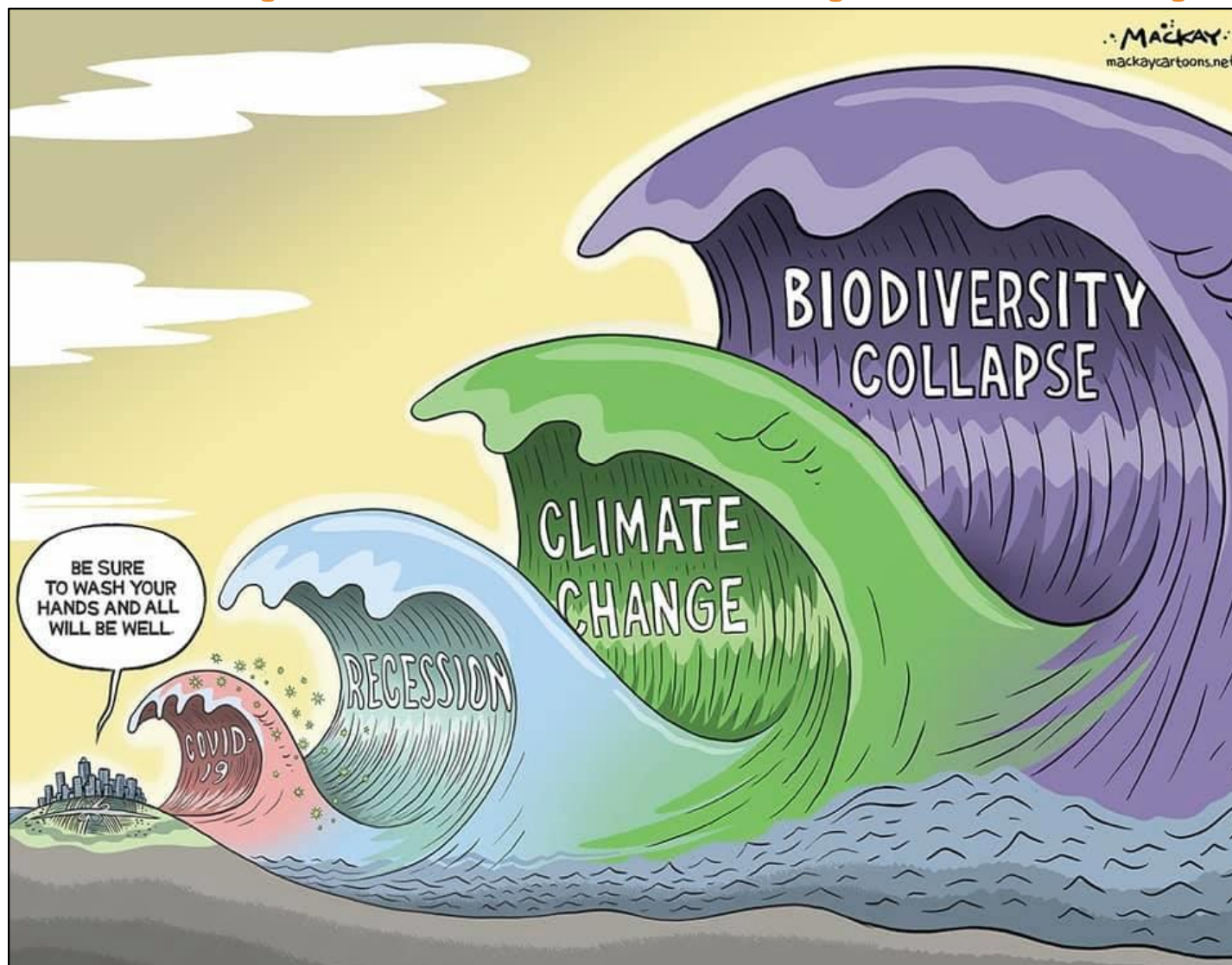

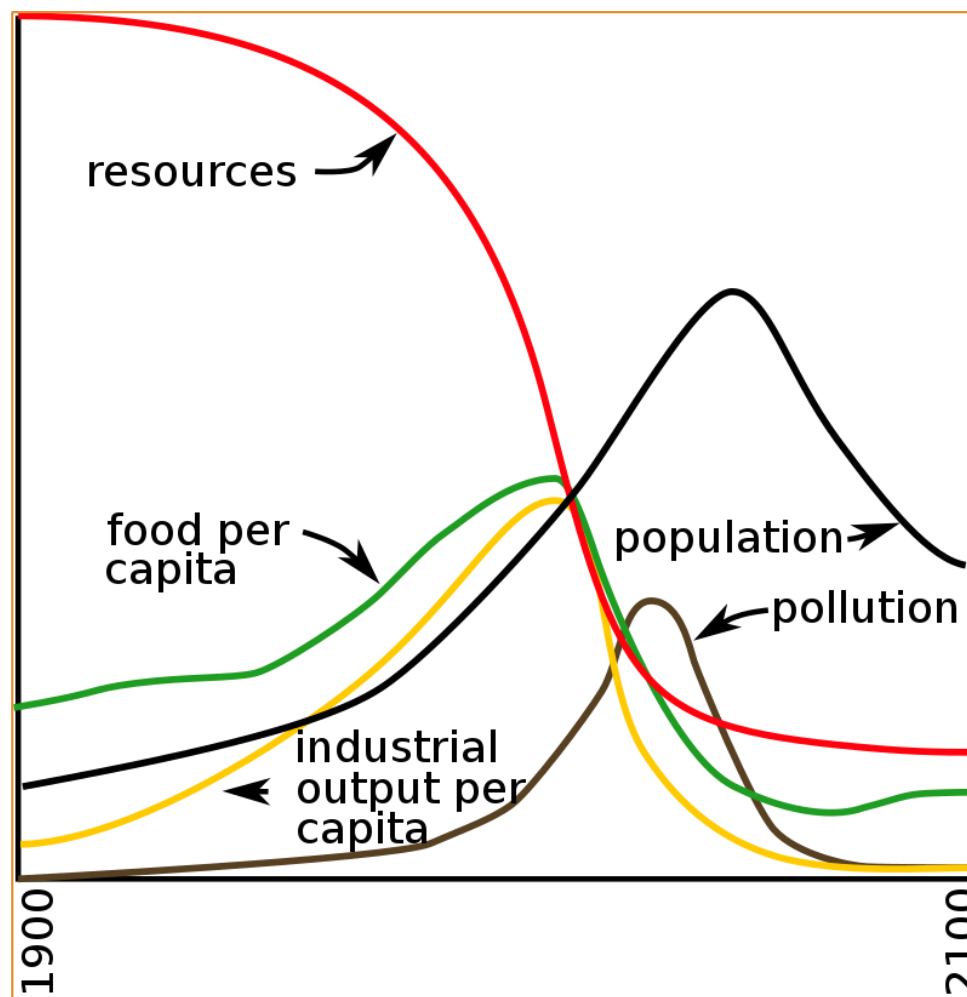

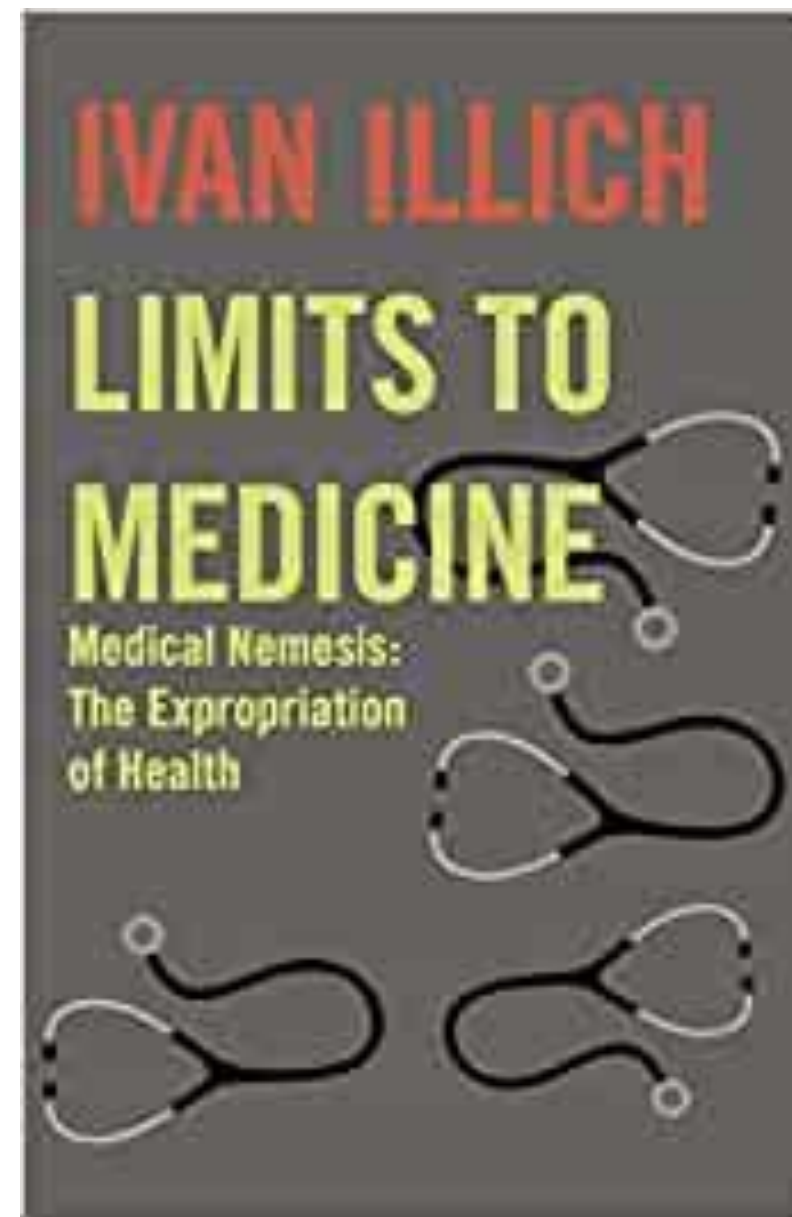


The Limits to Growth (1972)



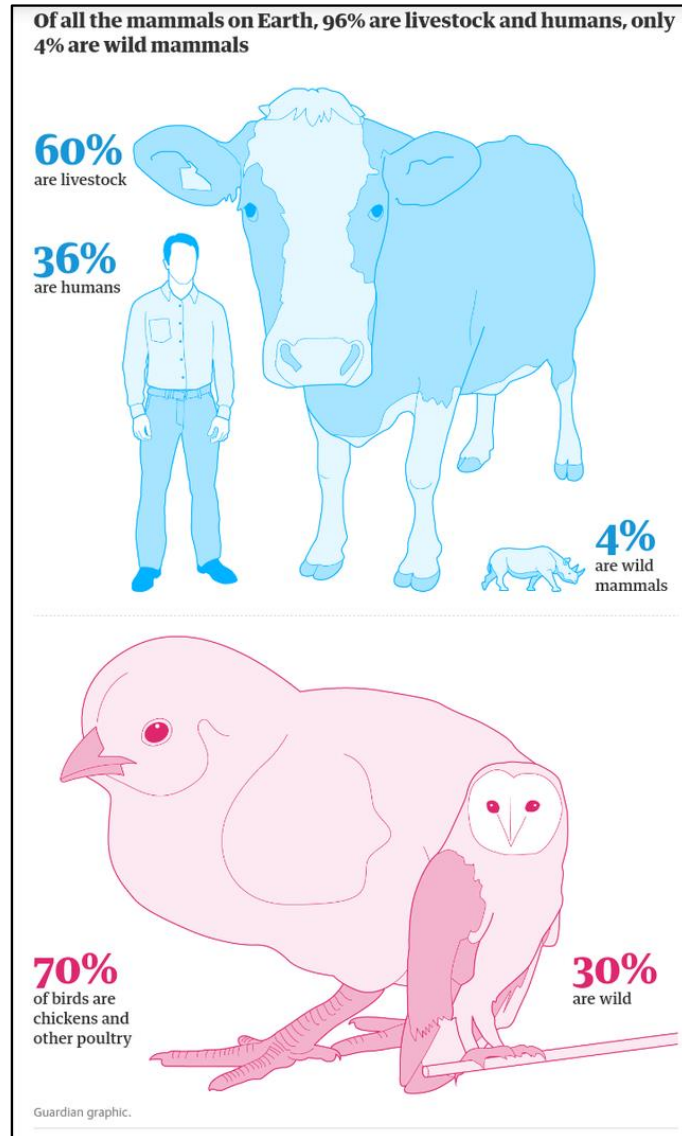
“If major changes to the consumption of resources are not undertaken, economic growth will peak and then rapidly decline by around 2040.” (Herrington, 2021)
